# Traffic

To ensure smooth traffic flow, we ask that parents not stop or drop students off on the avenue or at the entrance to the car park. Stopping cars impede the flow of vehicles into and out of the car park and create congestion for all. Please also note that traffic leaving the school grounds should give way to traffic coming from the main road. I appreciate your support with this.

From October, Irish Water will carry out road works on Ferndale Road for three months, and Ferndale Road users will have to take diversions. We will pass on information from Irish Water as we receive it.

Please note that if you are a user of Ballyman Road, the road works will start on Oct 10, and a diversion via Rathmichael will be in place.

# **School Events**

#### 1st-year enrollment August 2023

Our Open Days on Wednesday, Sept 21, and Saturday, Sept 24, were very well attended, with over 300 people attending over the two days. We thank all the student volunteers who acted as tour guides and teachers for helping out.

We will be enrolling two 1<sup>st</sup> year classes again in August 2023. The window for applications for enrollment into the 1<sup>st</sup> year of August 2023 is between October 3 and October 21. Our admissions policy gives preference to siblings and children coming from the John Scottus Primary schools. If you are interested in enrolling a sibling, please submit an application form by October 21, as we expect the number of applications to exceed the number of places available.

# **Cyber safety program**

On Sept 9, all 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> years attended cyber safety workshops. The workshop was run by Cyber Safe Kids (for information about Cyber Safe Kids, please see <u>CyberSafeKids</u>). During the seminar, Cyber Safe Kids facilitated a workshop examining topics such as cyberbullying, creating a positive digital footprint, sexting and pornography, targeted advertising and scams, image and managing digital wellbeing and applying critical

thinking skills to online information. We hope your child found the workshop to be of benefit.

# Study Skills Workshop

A study skills workshop will take place for 3rd, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>-year students on Monday, Oct 3<sup>rd</sup>. The workshop was very beneficial in the past, and we hope it will help students learn the required skills to succeed academically.

# Academic

## Leaving Certificate Results 2022

Well done to our graduating class of 2022 on their excellent results. 50% of students achieved 430 points or higher. I must mention one student, who received a terrific 613 points.

In addition, in over 40% of higher-level results, students achieved a H1 (over 90%) or H2 (over 80%). These are impressive results, and we congratulate the tremendous work of our students in the challenging circumstances of the past two years.

Most students were offered Level 8 degree courses, with the remaining going on to further education courses. The destinations are varied, with students moving on to study Art and Design, Science, Engineering, Veterinary, Health Sciences and Humanities.

#### Student Council

A student council has been elected with representatives from each class. Each class group has been asked to nominate three representatives from the students that wish to be on the student council. One student is elected by popular vote, one is chosen randomly from students who want to be on the council, and the class tutor selects one. We look forward to many constructive meetings with the student council over the coming year.

## 1st-year assessments

All 1<sup>st</sup> years completed CAT4 aptitude testing and NGRT reading tests in the recent weeks. These are used as a baseline to monitor academic progress over the next few years. The results will be sent to parents shortly.

# 6<sup>th</sup> year Higher Options

Our 6<sup>th</sup> year visited the Higher Options on Thursday, Sept 22. This is an excellent event for our 6<sup>th</sup>-year students to explore what careers and college courses they wish to pursue.

# Monday, September 26/Tuesday, Oct 11 - School Closed.

You may have a question about why the school closed on September 27. The school opens for the mandatory 166 days. The school year started on Monday, August 29 and

will finish on Friday, June 2. There is one day to allocate as a holiday, and we decided to break up the first half term, nine weeks long, with a long weekend.

Please note that the school is closed on Tuesday, Oct 11, to facilitate Junior Cycle Professional Development for all teachers. Each year the school is allocated two days for teacher professional development, the first of the two days given to the school. The second takes place on Tuesday, November 15.
