Traffic

The one-way system we use at the moment is as follows:

- Cars park in the parent car park if a space is available.
- If the car park is full, park on the left-hand side of the avenue behind the car in front, facing the school.
- When a place becomes available in the car park, please move into the car park.
- All cars must exit the school by driving through the car park and down the avenue.
- No car should turn on the avenue.
- Cars at the school entrance must yield to traffic from the main road.

It is essential that no car turns on the avenue and all cars exit via the school car park to minimise delays.

We will observe the situation closely and make further changes accordingly. I appreciate your support with this.

Road Closure

From October 16, Irish Water will carry out road works on Ferndale Road until November 17, and Ferndale Road users will have to take diversions. We will pass on information from Irish Water as we receive it.

Lost and Found

Mr Telford is operating a lost and found service. To help return items to students, we ask that all uniform items be clearly labelled. Labelling water bottles and lunchboxes would also be helpful.

School Events

1st-year enrollment August 2024

Our Open Days on Wednesday, September 20, and Saturday, September 23, were very well attended, with over 300 people attending over the two days. We thank all the student volunteers who acted as tour guides, parents and teachers for helping.

We will be enrolling two 1st year classes again in August 2024. The window for applications for enrollment into the 1st year of August 2024 is between October 2 and October 23. Our admissions policy gives preference to siblings and children coming from the John Scottus Primary schools. If you are interested in enrolling a sibling, please submit an application form by October 23, as we expect the number of applications to exceed the number of places available.

Social Media Workshop

On September 9, all 1st year students attended a social media workshop run by Sarann Wood, a parent in the school who runs a company specialising in online marketing. During the seminar, students explored topics such as cyberbullying, netiquette, creating a positive digital footprint and applying critical thinking skills to online information. We hope your child found the workshop to be of benefit and thank Sarann for running the workshop.

Study Skills Workshop

A study skills workshop will take place for 3rd, 5th and 6th-year students on Tuesday, October 3. The workshop was very beneficial in the past, and we hope it will help students learn the required skills to succeed academically.

Academic

Leaving Certificate Results 2023

I congratulate our graduating class of 2023 on their excellent results. 48% of students achieved 450 points or higher. These are impressive results, and we congratulate the tremendous work of our students in the challenging circumstances of the past two years.

93% of students were offered Level 8 degree courses, with the remaining going on to further education courses. The destinations are varied, with students moving on to study Art and Design, Science, Engineering, Music, Business, Health Sciences and Humanities.

Student Council

A student council has been elected with representatives from each class. Each class group has been asked to nominate three representatives from the students that wish to be on the student council. One student is elected by popular vote, one is chosen randomly from students who want to be on the council, and the class tutor selects one. We look forward to many constructive meetings with the student council over the coming year.

1st-year assessments

All 1st-year students completed CAT4 aptitude testing and NGRT reading tests in recent weeks. These are used as a baseline to monitor academic progress over the next few years. The results will be sent to parents shortly.

6th year Higher Options

Our 6th-year students visited the Higher Options on Wednesday, September 20. This is an excellent event for our 6th-year students to explore what careers and college courses they wish to pursue.

Monday, September 25/December 5 - School Closed.

You may have a question about why the school closed on September 25. The school opens for the mandatory 166 days. The school year started on Monday, August 28 and will finish on Friday, May 3. There is one day to allocate as a holiday, and we decided to break up the first half-term with a long weekend.

Please note that the school will close on Tuesday, December 5, to facilitate Junior Cycle Professional Development for all teachers. Each year, the school is allocated two days for teacher professional development. The first of the two days will take place on December 5.

Athletics

Our after-school athletics began on week two of school, and students are training now every Thursday after school from 3:40 pm to 4:40 pm. We are currently in cross-country season, mixing some distance running with some games for fun and general fitness. Our first event will be taking place in Avondale on Tuesday, October 24. Basketball

Our u16 (3rd year) basketball team have had a busy start to the year. After a successful 2nd year league last year, the boys, now 3rd year, are back playing in the under-16 East Dublin Boys league. There was no time for rest with our first games played recently. Unfortunately, we didn't get off to the best of starts, with two losses by the narrowest of margins. Both games were very competitive, and only lost by one basket. The boys played well and were just very unlucky to miss a few chances to win both games, but with a bit more practice, we are confident they will get there. We look forward to building on these skills over the coming weeks in preparation for our next game against Our Ladys Terenure.
